The 13th annual national reading month award ceremony was held on 16th November 2017 at the auditorium of the National Library and Documentation Services Board. This programme is conducted with the objective of promoting the reading habit of Sri Lankan people.



Sixty libraries including 30 public libraries, 20 school libraries and one technical college library which implemented reading promotion programmes successfully were presented awards in this ceremony to appreciate their contribution for the National Reading Month programme.



The special award was presented to senior journalist, Kala Keerthi Edwin Ariyadasa for his contribution for creating a knowledgeable society in Sri Lanka.

To mark the inauguration of the National Reading Month a badge was prepared on the theme of reading and the first badge was adorned to His excellency the President on the 2nd October 2017 at the Presidential Secretariat. The reading promotion programme organized in conjunction with the national reading month is implemented by the Presidential Secretariat in collaboration with the Ministry of Education. The inauguration ceremony of this programme was held on 6th September 2017 under the patronage of His Excellency the President Maithreepala Sirisena. 2200 selected schools were donated books in this ceremony. National Library and Documentation Services Board also contributes to this programme.



READING CORNERS IN RAILWAY STATIONS

Arrangements have been made to start reading corners in railway stations for the benefit of railway passengers. The objective of this programme is to provide the opportunity to read books for the passengers who are waiting for trains in stations. Actions have been taken to start reading corners in Galle, Hikkaduwa, Ambalangoda, Polgahawela, Kurunegala, Mahawa, Batticaloa, Jaffna, Matale and Ella railway stations as a pilot project.

Awareness Raising Programme



National Library and Documentation Services Board (NLDSB) has made arrangement to start an awareness raising programme on the activities of the NLDSB through displaying stickers in buses in selected areas of the country. As the first step displaying of stickers has been started in Kurunegala - Kandy buses and Moratuwa - Pettah buses.

COMMEMORATION OF SCHOOL LIBRARY MONTH AND SCHOOL LIBRARY DAY

The month of October has been declared as the school library month and the last week of October as the school library week and the Monday of the last week of October as school library day by the International Association of School Librarianship. To commemorate this event, actions have been taken to set up reading and talking societies in school level, starting reading circles, encouraging students to start wall newspapers and writing books, compiling newspaper and periodical articles and organizing essay competitions and short story competitions.

National Library and Documentation Services Board (NLDSB) implements various programmes for the promotion of reading habit among the Sri Lanka community. As another step of promoting reading habit, NLDSB launched the website Kiyawamu.lk in collaboration with the Sri Lanka Telecom.

Launching of this website took place on 16th July 2017 in the Colombo International Book Fair in BMICH premises under the patronage of His Excellency the President Maithreepala Sirisena, Hon. Akila Viraj Kariyawasam, Ministry of Education, Chairman, Director General and the senior staff of the NLDSB were also present on the occasion. Some books on this website can be used free of charge and some books can be used by paying a concessionary payment.



WORKSHOP ON PALM LEAF MANUSCRIPT

The International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions and the National Library and Documentation Services Board jointly organized workshop on Palm Leaf Manuscript. The workshop was held from 6th - 7th July 2017 at the NLDSB with 17 participants from libraries in the region as well as international experts. The objective of the workshop was to address the problems encountered by libraries and holders of Palm Leaf Manuscript collections throughout the region. Absence of Metadata and digitization standards for Palm Leaf Manuscripts was a problem faced by many libraries in the region and capacity building should be placed to preserve for the future.



ICH NETWORK MEETING IN THE SOUTH ASIA

Sub- regional ICH Network meeting in the South Asia , was held in Nepal from 16th to 17th August 2017. The objective of the meeting was to foster international collaboration and build international and regional networks of experts and government stakeholders for the effective implementation of the 2003 Convention. The meeting was organized by the UNESCO office in Kathmandu and the International Information and Networking Centre for Intangible Cultural Heritage in the Asia Pacific Region under the auspices of UNESCO (ICHCAP), jointly with the Cultural Division , Ministry of Culture, Tourism and Civil Aviation of Nepal. Mr. W. Sunil , Director General ,NLDDB participated the meeting.



WORKSHOP ON CHALLENGES AND CHANGES OF LIBRARIES IN THE DIGITAL AGE

IFLA Global Vision programme

Under the IFLA Global Vision programme launched by the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions it has been planned to prepare the criteria on the guidelines on how the librarians in the world should work. For this purpose, it is expected to obtain information from librarians representing all countries of the world through a questionnaire.

As the national centre of library field in Sri Lanka, National Library and Documentation Services Board obtained information from selected librarians representing all 24 districts through a questionnaire and sent the relevant responses to IFLA. To obtain information a workshop was held on 23rd August 2017 in NLDSB.



NATIONAL LIBRARY RESEARCH SYMPOSIUM



The National Library Research Symposium organized by the National Library and Documentation Services Board was held on 20th September 2017 in the National Library auditorium. Objective of organizing this symposium was to provide an opportunity for library professionals to present their research papers and encourage library research. The Chief guest in the inauguration ceremony was Mr. Sunil Hettiarachchi, Secretary, Ministry of Education. FOREIGN SUPPORT TO PROTECT HERITAGE SITE

On the intervention of the Ministry of Education , the National Library and Documentation Services Board has signed agreements with various countries in order to obtain foreign assistance for the conservation of archaeological heritage and archaeological premises. Accordingly the agreements have been signed with the countries such as France, Poland, Korea, Malaysia , Nigeria and Kuwait.

DONATION OF BOOKS FOR THE INTERNATIONAL LIBRARY PROPOSED TO BE ESTABLISHED IN THE NEW ADMINISTRATIVE CITY IN EGYPT

Sri Lankan maps and books have been donated to the international library proposed to be established in the new administrative city in Egypt by the NLDSB in Sri Lanka. This donation of books and maps was organized on the intervention of the Ministry of Education as a result of a request made by the Embassy of Egypt to the Foreign ministry of Sri Lanka and it was a great opportunity to promote history and culture of Sri Lanka.

VISIT OF THE CHINA DELEGATIONS TO THE NATIONAL LIBRARY

Five member Chinese Deligation from Qingdao Municipal Bureau of Culture, Radio, Television, Press and Publications visited the National Library of Sri Lanka on the 25th July 2017 under the cultural relations programme between the National Library of Sri Lanka and the Embassy of the People's Republic of China in Sri Lanka.



Another special delegation from China visited the National Library of Sri Lanka on the 27th September 2017, concurrently with the completion of 60 years of foreign relations between China and Sri Lanka and holding the Guangxi Cultural Week in Sri Lanka from 23rd September to 29th September 2017. The tour helped to exchange views on promoting the cultural exchange and co-operation in the library field between the two countries.

FOMULATION OF MODEL LIBRARY STATUTE FOR SRI LANKA

DEVELOPMENT OF FACILITIES OF RURAL LIBRARIES

NLDSB Organized a programme for the development of facilities of rural libraries, in conjunction with the National Reading Month. Arrangements have been made to donate tables, chairs, racks, books and stationaries to selected rural libraries with the objective of developing the facilities of these libraries. In the year 2017 facilities are developed in 18 rural libraries under this project

REBUILDING THE LIBRARIES DAMAGED DUE TO FLOOD

A large number of libraries have been damaged due to the recent floods and earth slips. These libraries have already been donated books to the value of Rs. 50,000.00 each. As the second stage of the programme, books were collection in the international book exhibition held in BMICH from 15th to 24th September for rebuilding the 30 schools and privena libraries destroyed due to recent floods. This was carried out by the National Library and Documentation Services Board in collaboration with “Manusath Derana”. In addition, books were collected in eleven libraries in the country.



WORKSHOP ON RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

A four-day workshop on Research Methodology was held at NILIS, University of Colombo, from 25th to 28th October 2017. The main objective of this workshop was to give participants insight about the process of research and build their capacity on research methods and design. DIGITIZATION OF NATIONAL LIBRARY PUBLICATIONS

National Library and Documentation Services Board (NLDSB) has made an arrangement to digitize the NLDSB publications with the financial assistance of National Science Foundation (NSF) under the National Digitization Project of NSF. This project is very helpful for the preservation and wider access for NLDSB publications.

The Digital Library Unit of the National Library and Documentation Services Board organized a workshop on DSpace library software for the staff of the NLDSB who handle the digital library activities on 15th - 16th June 2017. Mr. Buddin Kumara, Senior Assistant Librarian of the Moratuwa University served as the resource person of the workshop.



RIVISION OF THE SERVICE MINUTE OF GOVERNMENT LIBRARIANS

The service minute of the government librarians has been published in government gazette dated on 16th October 2017. The scholars and trade unions in the library and information field have pointed out that the government librarians have to suffer an injustice due to this service minute. Therefore, action are being taken by the National Library and Documentation Services Board to revise of this service minute with the assistance of some academic in the field.

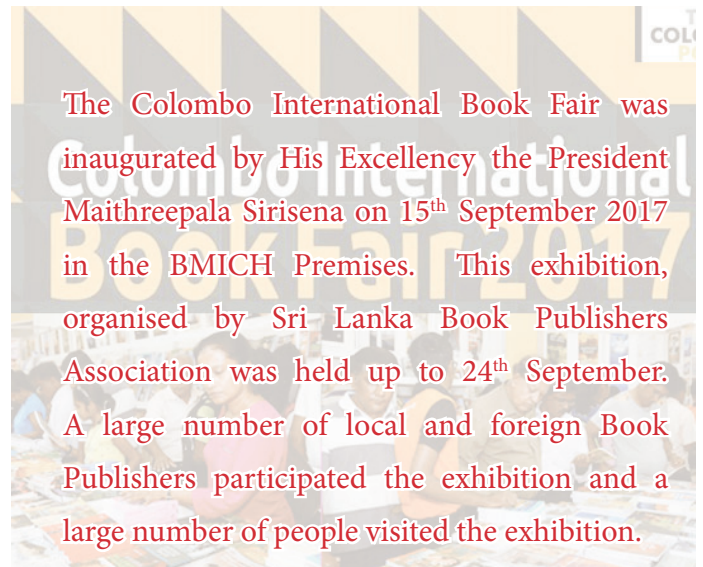

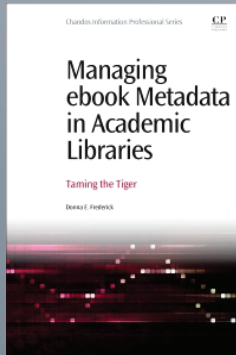


National Library of Sri Lanka introduced a new electronic membership card for readers. The launching of this new card took place during the National Reading Month 2017



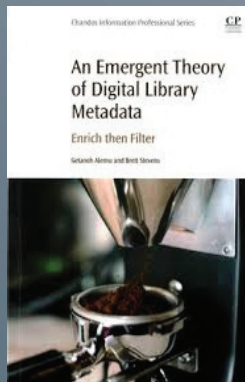

Managing eBook Metadata in Academic Libraries:



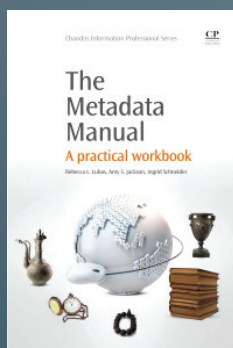

An Emergent Theory of Digital Library Metadata



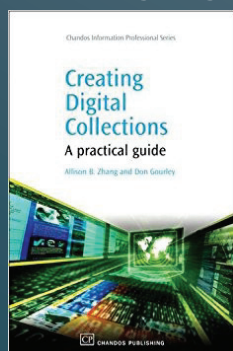

The Metadata Manual A Practical Workbook



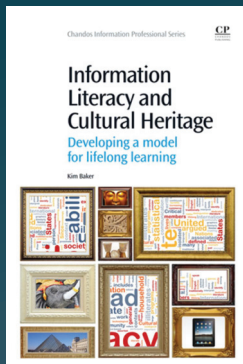

Creating Digital Collections: A Practical Guide



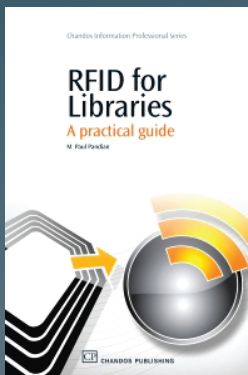

Information Literacy and Cultural Heritage



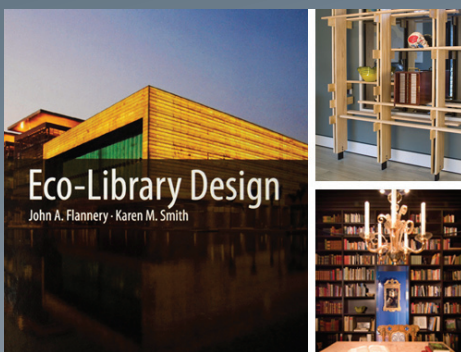

RFID for Libraries :A Practical Guide



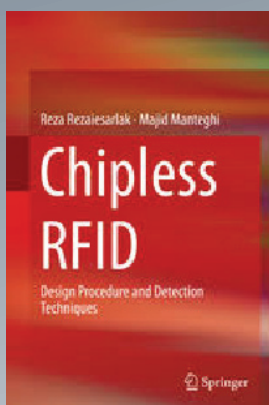
Many modern technologies give the impression that they somehow work by magic, particularly when they operate automatically and their mechanisms are invisible. A technology called RFID (Radio Frequency Identification), which is relatively new, has exactly this characteristic. Librarians everywhere are closely watching RFID technology. Advances over using bar codes on library materials, RFID tags are being touted as a way to radically redesign how library materials are handled. But it is expensive. The tags are vulnerable to wear and tear and the technology is not fully developed.
